Driven to Opportunity would provide the only rural 24 hour, 7 days a week work-related on-demand public transportation in Thurston and Mason counties. It would provide curb to curb services to jobs, interviews and trainings needed to help residents who don't have easy access to Transit route because they are so rural.

Why is this project needed, and how does this proposal address the need?

Need*:

Driven To Opportunity (DTO) in Thurston and Mason Counties seeks 2 vehicles to ensure operational reliability for the program. Through preventative maintenance, we will be able to extend the life span of our vehicle. Reliable job access is associated with economic progress- housing, quality food and healthcare. This project is a lifeline to gaining employment and staying employed. DTO improves livelihood, reduces poverty and promotes economic vitality in our community. Lack of access to affordable and reliable transportation has been one of the biggest hurdles to finding and keeping a job, particularly for individuals with limited income, single parents, and others transitioning to work. Children can be dropped at child care with a qualifying adult going to work/training to help working parents maintain their employment and provide for their families. DTO staff coordinates with local transit to avoid duplication of services and help only those who cannot utilize transit.

Coordination Efforts*:

Coastal CAP actively participates in the Southwest Washington RTPO that covers a five county region, including Thurston and Mason County. The Driven To Opportunity program in Thurston and Mason County, is listed in WSDOT Human Services Transportation Plan (HSTP). We have collaborated with WSDOT regional staff, Elizabeth Safsten and Bill Bauman our community liaison. In addition, CCAP has made connections and established relationships with Mason Transit Authority and Intercity Transit. We are in collaboration with both Cowlitz-Wahkiakum Council of Governments and Peninsula RTPO. Coastal CAP actively tries to work with all transportation companies to help communities find solutions at the local level to improve transportation access with the ultimate goal of enhancing the quality of life for its residents.

Special Needs Transportation:

The project helps alleviate the following unmet needs identified in the HSTP- sustain transportation for low income, TANF, and underemployed individuals during off-transit hours and access to job and job training needs to be expanded for rural residents. DTO has access to a wheelchair accessible vehicle to serve our special needs riders. The project advances efficiencies and accessibility of special needs transportation through a user-oriented, curb-to-curb form of public transportation. It is characterized by flexible routing and scheduling in shared-ride mode according to

passenger needs. Its flexibility makes it more suitable to serve areas of low passenger demand, such as rural areas, where a regular bus service would not be sustainable. DTO provides special needs riders, such as but not limited to clients with developmental disabilities, essential access to employment and educational opportunities not always offered by transit so can become part of the community and perhaps someday live on their own. All DTO drivers and dispatchers take an ADAPTS passenger assistance training to assist in safely transporting passengers with special needs.

Measurement of Efficiency and Effectiveness*:

CCAP has been offering the Driven To Opportunity Program in Thurston and Mason county residents since September 2021. During this time our program has been highly successful. Coastal CAP's DTO program does not solely determine success based on the number of trips, miles and hours of the project, but also on the success of our riders. Rider success includes: obtaining and/or maintaining jobs, promotion of better working hours that are in sync with public transportation, attainment of a driver's license, paying off fines to get a license reinstated and/or purchasing a vehicle. In short we succeed if our clients succeed. DTO enhances public transportation with a safe, affordable, flexible service that operates 24/7 including holidays to fill the work transportation gap. DTO's short term goal is to support riders while they become self-sufficient. The ultimate goal of the project is to provide safe, reliable and cost effective employment transportation that improves our communities and economic vitality for people and businesses.

Other Modes of Transportation*:

DTO connects riders to both Intercity Transit and Mason County transit at their stations for a first mile/last mile partnership. While transit helps provide the core of rides to and from work or school, it's not always an option for both portions of the trip. The rural layout of both counties presents challenges reaching fixed route transit and walking/bicycling is not always feasible due to distance. Most shift-work employees are working late at night or on weekends when conventional transit services are either reduced or non-exist. DTO enhances public transportation by connecting riders to transit with a safe, affordable, flexible service that operates 24/7, including holidays. It supplements fixed route transit and increases employment transportation access. Most employment related trips are complex and involve multiple destinations including reaching childcare centers. Children can be dropped at child care with a qualifying adult going to work/training to help working parents maintain their employment and provide for their families. DTO staff coordinates with transit to connect riders, avoid duplication of services and help only those who cannot utilize transit.

While we see the need to replace our whole aging fleet due to the number of average miles and repair/maintenance costs, we see the urgent need for at least one replacement vehicle at this time. The program relies on punctuality and reliability to assist our clientele with their transportation barriers to ensure they are able to arrive at their employment or other destination on time. Replacing this vehicle will help continue the reputation that we have built over the years of this program of being on time and very reliable. If we had mechanical breakdowns this could result in the clientele that we serve losing their jobs and possibility even their housing. Vans have a shorter life expectancy than most transit vehicles. All DTO vehicles have surpassed their useful minimum useful life of four years or 100,000 miles per the FTA Vehicle Disposition Schedule.

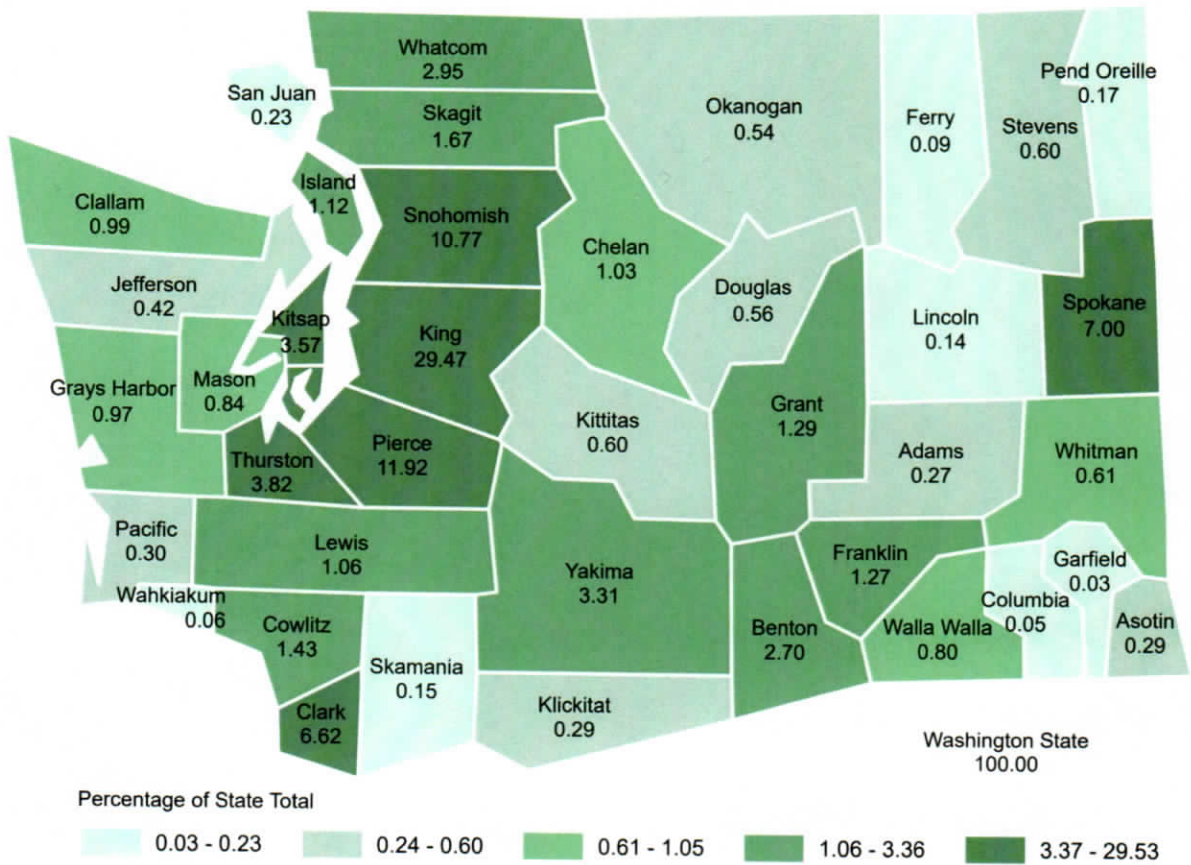

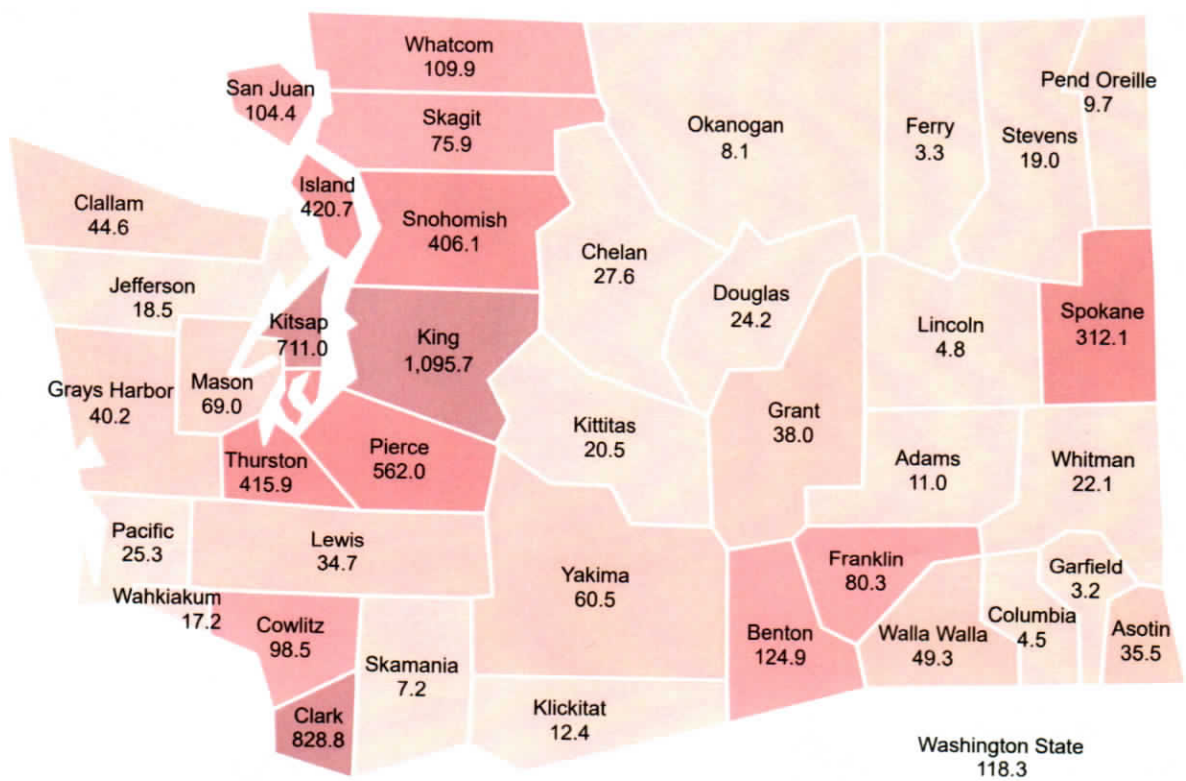
