Proposed scope/description of the work.*:

This project preserves existing Fixed Route and On-Demand ADA service for the residents of East Jefferson County. The communities of Port Townsend, Brinnon, Quilcene, and the Tri-Area (Port Hadlock, Irondale & Chimacum) are home to some of the most vulnerable and transit dependent individuals in the community.

Why is this project needed, and how does this proposal address the need?

Need*:

Service needs have been identified through many ways. Formulation of a long-range plan, annual updating of JTA's Transit Development Plan (TDP), and numerous community forums and surveys to solicit the input of current and potential riders. JTA's service provides connectivity with Clallam, Mason, and Kitsap Transits as well as the Washington State Ferries. The areas served have been identified as the fastest growing regions in Jefferson County. These areas are home to large numbers of senior citizens, people with disabilities, and people living at or below the poverty level, who are more transit dependent. These vulnerable populations are a main focus of the Peninsula RTPO's Human Services Transportation Plan. As service needs are identified and developed, major consideration will be given to the older residents who live in this region for the favorable weather conditions and beautiful scenery. Owning and operating a vehicle is also one of the largest household expenses after rent or mortgage, deeming it important to make sure service fits the needs of lower income households who may not be able to afford a vehicle. JTA's service has been widely supported by the residents of Jefferson County through passage of three sales tax initiatives, putting JTA at its legislative maximum and unable to request additional funding.

Coordination Efforts*:

Jefferson Transit continues to be an active member of the Peninsula RTPO where members meet quarterly to discuss and vote on issues involving the future of peninsula cities, towns, counties, ports, tribes, and transit agencies. Nicole Gauthier, Interim General Manager, sits on the Executive Board (EB) while Miranda Nash, Interim Finance Manager, and Jayme Brooke, Grants & Procurement Coordinator, sit on the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC). This service is identified for continuation in our Peninsula RTPO's Regional Human Services and Public Transit Coordination Plan.

How does the project advance efficiencies in, accessibility to, or coordination of transportation services provided to persons with special transportation needs?

Special Needs Transportation:

There are a significant number of senior citizens, people with disabilities, and those living at or below the poverty level that depend on these services. Jefferson Transit provides ADA Paratransit Services in areas that have fixed route service. ADA Paratransit service provides safe, effective, and efficient door-to-door (line of sight) specialized transportation service, fully compliant with the ADA requirements, for people unable to utilize the fixed route system. Lifeline services are incorporated into the routes such as the Port Townsend, Tri-Area and Quilcene Food Banks; Port Townsend and Jefferson County Libraries; Port Townsend City Hall and Jefferson County Courthouse; Jefferson Healthcare, Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS), and the Olympic Area Agency on Aging (O3A). Jefferson Transit travels beyond the ADA 3/4 miles requirement by providing one-day per week service to Kala Point, Marrowstone Island, and Cape George.

Measurement of Efficiency and Effectiveness*:

Jefferson Transit tracks ridership, service efficiency (boardings per hour), and maintenance cost per mile for fixed route and Dial-A-Ride. Fixed route ridership is tracked through "click-counters" operated by drivers to count riders boarding the bus. Dial-A-Ride ridership is tracked through the use of RouteMatch software. Jefferson Transit continuously gathers community input on its performance and level of service through customer comments and direct community contact. JTA's Transit Advisory Group participates in tabling events regularly. Examples of some events attended during the past year are: Farmer's Markets, school sporting events, Jefferson County Fair, and the Quilcene Fair.

Jefferson Transit provides numerous public transit connections allowing access from Jefferson County to Clallam, Mason, and Kitsap Counties. Additionally, this service provides a link to Clallam County for the West Jefferson Olympic Connection service and to Grays Harbor Transit system. Jefferson Transit provides links to the Washington State Ferries. Our East Jefferson County service connects passengers with the Port Townsend Ferry which sails to Coupeville. Riding Jefferson Transit to Poulsbo or Kingston, passengers can connect with Kitsap Transit which will connect them with buses or ferries going to Edmonds or Seattle. Many passengers use the Seattle connection to see medical specialists and to obtain other needed services in these large urban areas.

Estimated net operating expenses from the 2021-2023 biennium to the 2023-2025 biennium are increased by an estimated 31.46% due to record inflation, union wage increases, and historically unprecedented fuel cost increases. Estimated net operating expenses from the 2023-2025 biennium to the 2025-2027 biennium are increased by an estimated modest 3% due to the same reasons with limited economic forecasts.

Other Sources

Other Sources*:

Jefferson Transit believes that providing public transportation for this region is vital. Jefferson Transit intends to continue to solicit funding from state and federal sources into the future, as well as provide local funding from sales tax revenues. Jefferson Transit's sales tax rate is at the maximum of .9%. This shows tremendous support from the community, however, with a county population of approximately 33,000, this brings in limited funding. Jefferson Transit will continue to fund this service using a combination of grant funding and general transit sales tax revenues as

necessary. Jefferson Transit is currently planning coordination meetings with other special needs service providers in Jefferson County (OlyCAP and ECHHO) to determine if service efficiencies are possible/feasible.

Comments

Comments*:

Jefferson Transit utilized the invoices submitted to WSDOT for the 2021-2023 grant biennium to forecast the budget for the 2023-2025 and 2025-2027 grant biennia. Jefferson Transit has predicted increases for labor. Represented labor will receive contractual increases, non-Represented staff will also see compensatory increases. Jefferson Transit plans to budget \$20,000 in 2023 in order to conduct a salary survey, so a larger than normal increase is anticipated in the 2023-2025 biennium. Fuel costs have seen historic increases since 2020, which are reflected in the increase to the budget line item. Health insurance rates are projected to continue to increase significantly over the next two years. Liability Insurance rates increased over the past biennium; this trend is likely to continue. Maintaining an aging fleet continues to contribute to the cost of Vehicle Maintenance. Utilities are projected to increase. The 2025-2027 grant biennium expense/revenue increases are forecasted conservatively.

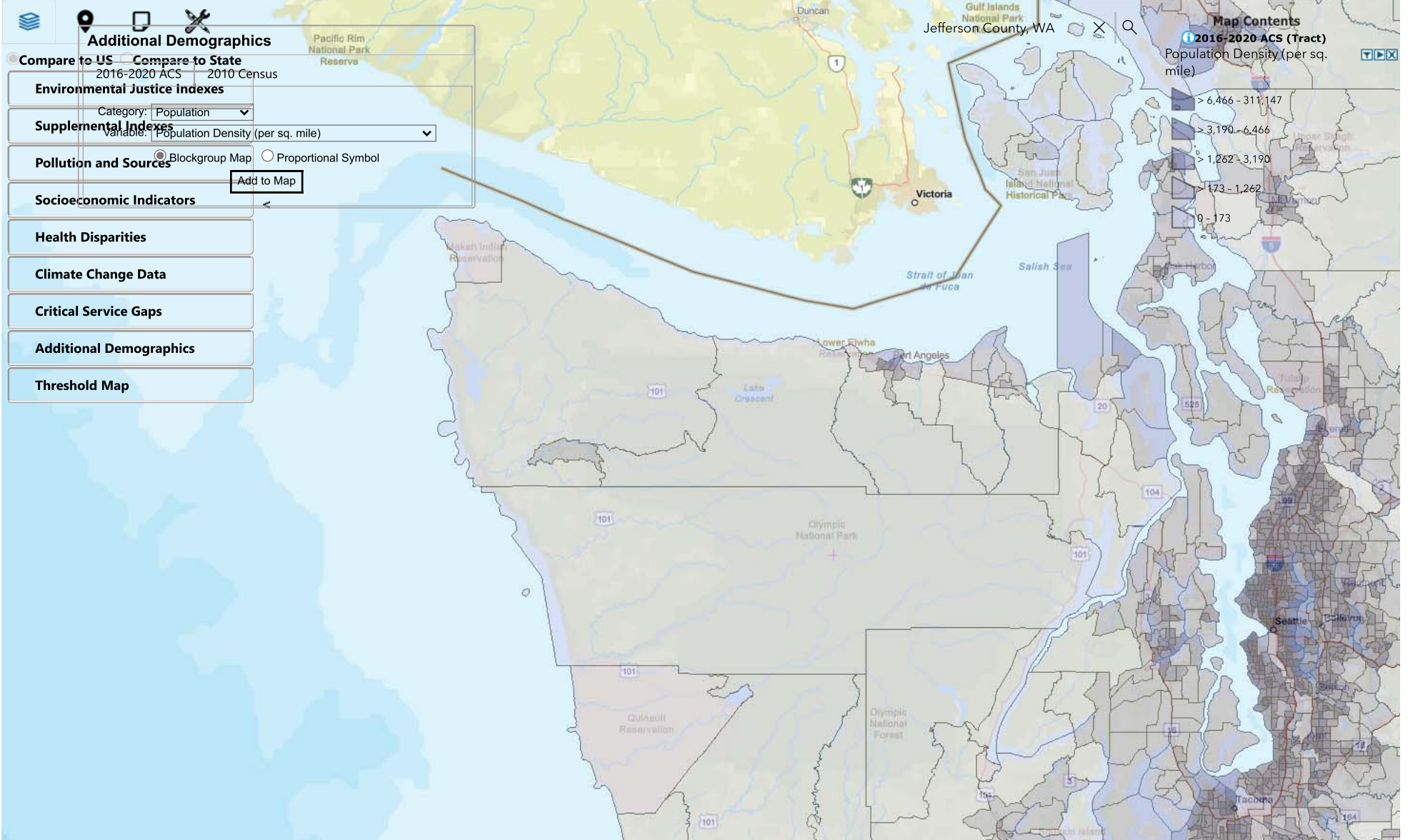

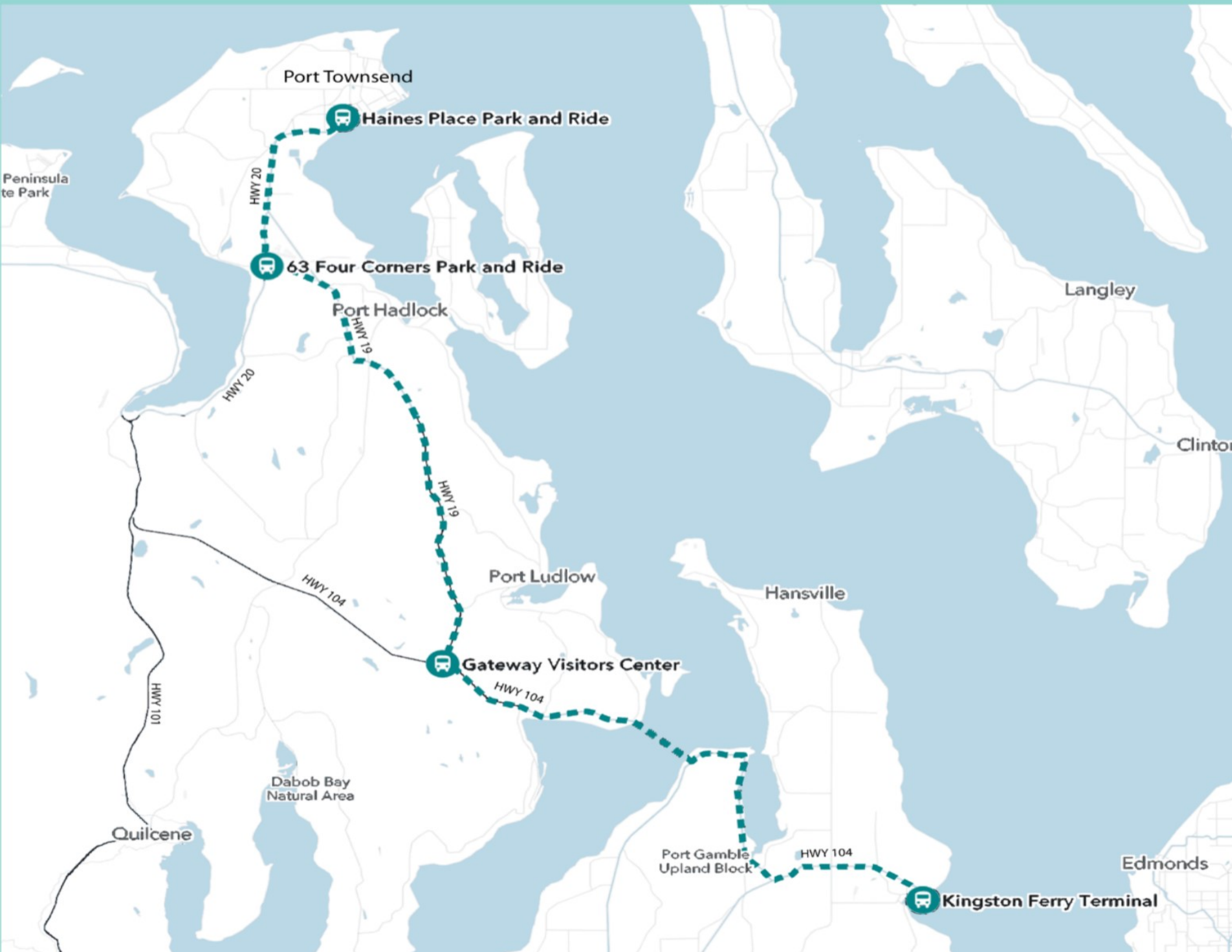

Dear Nicole:

The City of Port Townsend is pleased to support Jefferson Transit Authority (JTA) in your grant request to WSDOT to sustain and enhance current levels of fixed route services to special needs and economically disadvantaged areas of Port Townsend, the Tri-Area, Brinnon/Quilcene, including connections to Grays Harbor, Mason, Clallam, Quinault Nation and Kitsap Transits and to the Washington State Ferries.

Many residents of Jefferson County need to travel to work, education, and other purposes within Jefferson County or in adjacent cities through connections with transit systems in Kitsap, Mason, Clallam, Grays Harbor Counties, the Quinault Nation, and the Washington State Ferry System. By providing both fixed route and demand response service on both coasts of the Olympic Peninsula, Jefferson Transit Authority can meet the transportation needs of a large segment of the population of Jefferson County.

Transit has a positive impact in these remote and rural communities. 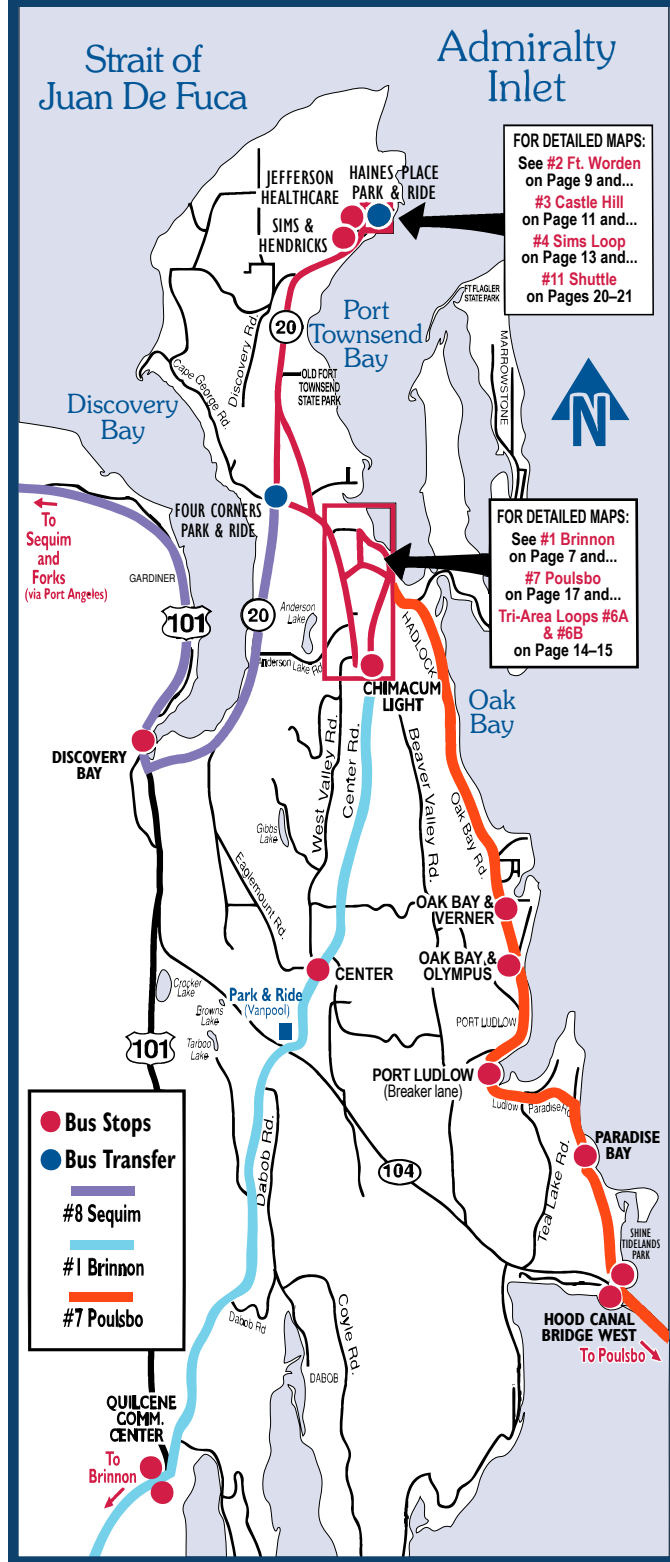

#1 BRINNON ROUTE MAP



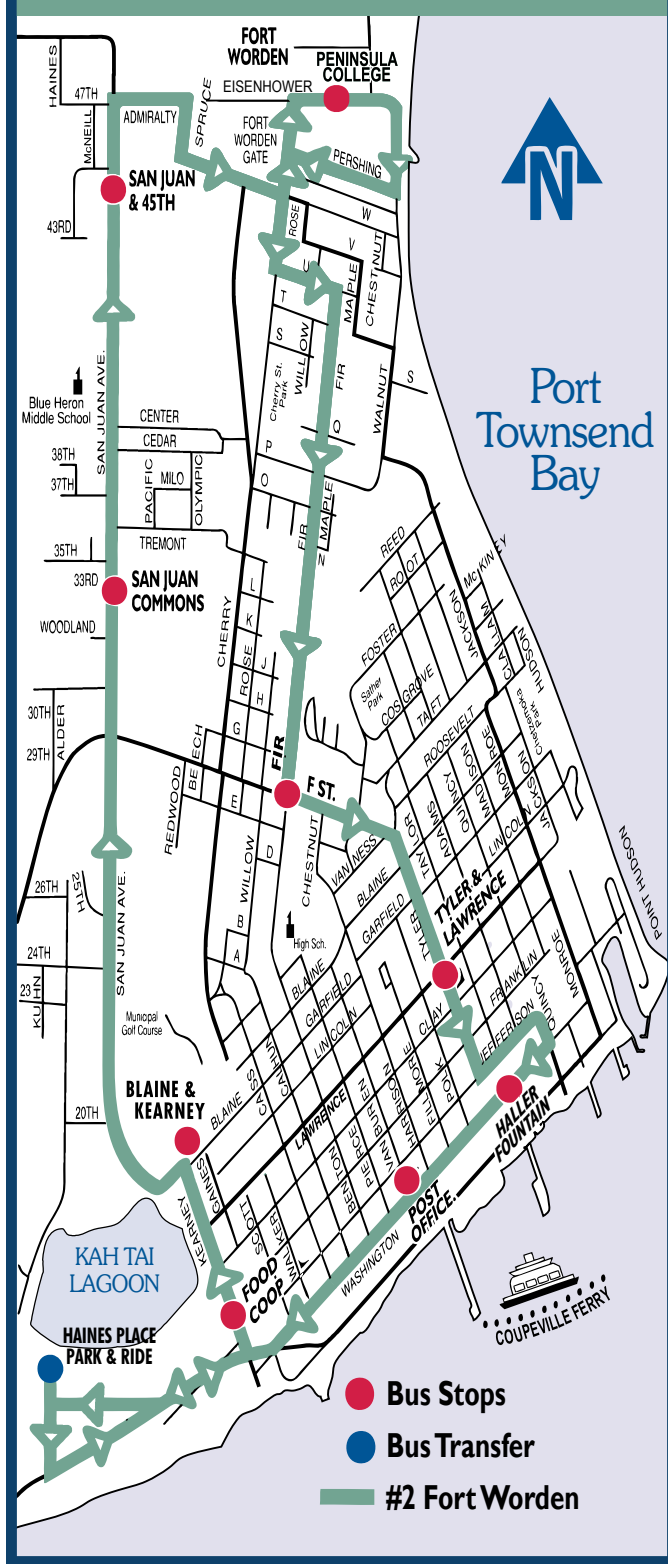

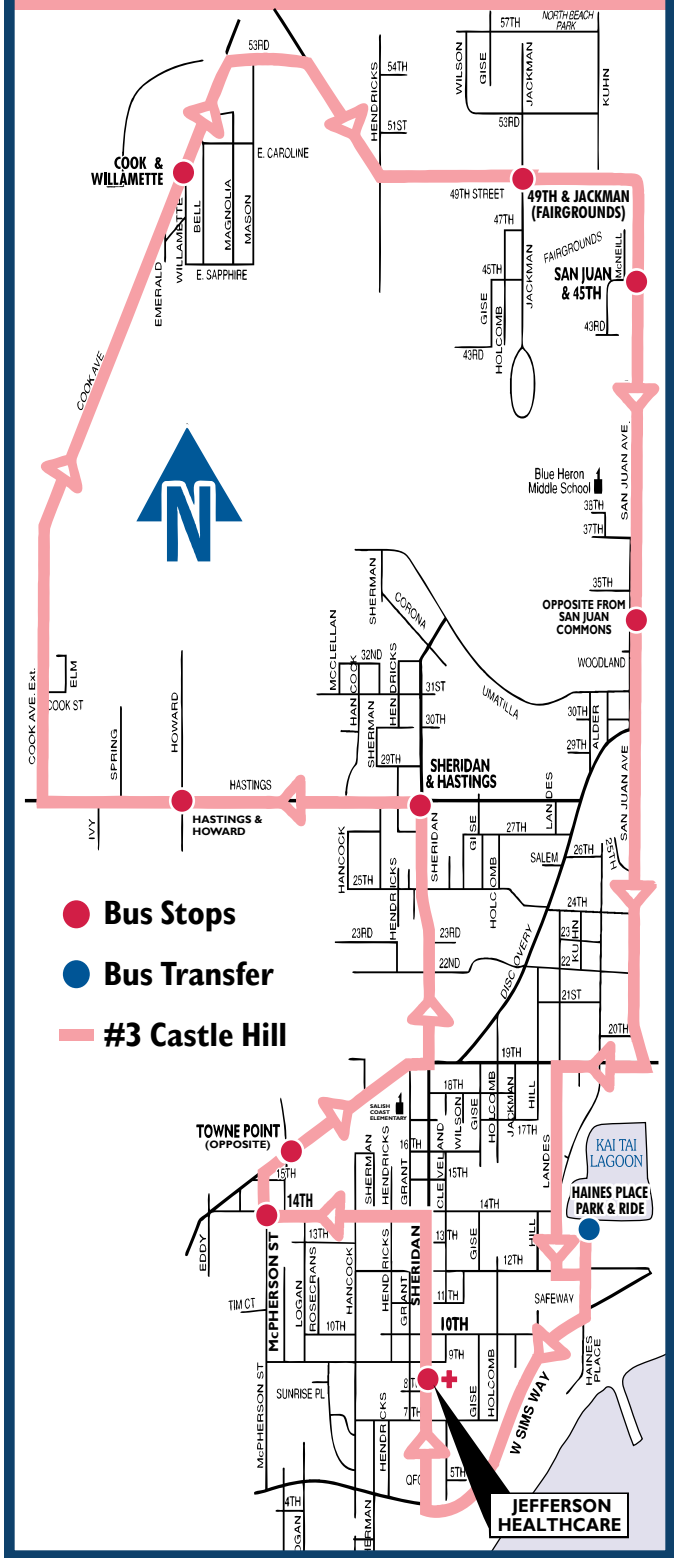
#2 FORT WORDEN ROUTE MAP

PASSENGER CODE OF CONDUCT

For the safety and comfort of all, Jefferson Transit Authority requires our customers to:

- Ride quietly and respect the rights of other passengers
- Pay the correct cash fare or show a pass when boarding
- Remain seated while the bus is in motion
- Hold on to a hand rail while the bus is in motion if no seats are available
- Allow transit operators to drive their Vehicles safely
- Keep all beverages in spill-proof containers
- Refrain from eating on all Jefferson Transit Vehicles
- Not carry hazardous materials while riding on any Jefferson Transit Vehicle
- Keep animals, including pets and service animals, under close control or in a closed container
- Cross behind buses, and wait until after the buses leave to cross the street
- Walk with bikes and carry skateboards at any Jefferson Transit Authority properties
- Keep aisles free of all items

Violations of RCW 9.91.025 include:

- Using drugs or alcohol, smoking, littering, spitting, possessing strong body odors, playing audible music, swearing, or otherwise behaving in an unruly or harassing manner are all prohibited on all Jefferson Transit Property and vehicles
- Possession of unissued transfer or fare media or tenders an unissued transfer or fare media as proof of payment.

Jefferson Transit will exclude any passenger for not complying with Jefferson Transit Passenger Code of Conduct or the Revised Code of Washington (RCW 9.91.025) which further governs passenger conduct.

Non-Discrimination Policy and Procedure:

Pursuant to Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title II of the Americans with Disabilities, Environmental Justice regulations, and in accordance with applicable state and local laws: Jefferson Transit Authority grants all citizens equal access to its transportation services. If you believe you have received discriminatory treatment by Jefferson Transit Authority on the basis of your race, color, national origin, economic status, disability or limited English proficiency, you have the right to file a formal complaint. 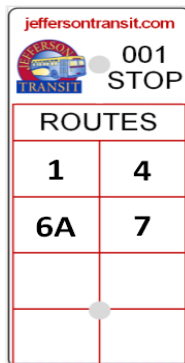
